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This module can be taken individually or combined with the Training Delivery and Evaluation Module (6N3326) in order to gain the QQI higher Special Purpose Award – **Training & Development Special Purpose Award (6S3372).** 

Trainers who have completed the previous FETAC Train the Trainer award certified through FETAC can gain an exemption for the second module of the new Special Purpose Award – (Training Delivery and Evaluation - 6N3326) and only need to complete the Training Needs Identification and Design Module – 6N3325 to receive the new Training & Development Special Purpose Award (6S3372). It is expected that this new Award overtime will become the standard requirement for trainers working on all ETB/SOLAS funded training.

This exemption from QQI for the old award will only be available until December 2015.
